


Planting wildflower plugs – all in!.

WILD FLOWER VERGES

Local Green councillors Carol and Neil persuaded Barton Town Council to plant wildflower verges. The first in Barton is on Butts Road. Helped by local residents, a cornfield mix was sown in May 2021.

Neil said "Wildflower verges are the future — good for the environment, good for local residents and **good for reducing the costs** of grass cutting". Carol added "It's vital we do all we can to help the **bees** and other insects being harmed by the use of pesticides. We've lost so much wildlife but here we are doing our bit to help reverse this."

A good **public transport** system is good for people and planet. Green Campaigner Amie said "We need public transport that gets people to where they want, when they want and at an **affordable** cost."
